

Texas Ebony Pithecellobium flexicaule

Texas ebony is a medium sized evergreen tree. It is native to the Rio Grande plains of South Texas and grows in thick motts in areas with sandy loam. The small darkgreen glossy leaves are arranged along thorned branches. Creamy yellow, fragrant puff-ball flowers are produced from May through October. Local lore says that when you see ebony trees blooming, its going to rain. However, I have noticed that when you get rain, you can expect to see ebony trees blooming. The flowers are followed by a

large woody pods. Plant this tree where the pods wont become a nuisance. Birds love to nest in Ebony trees - maybe the dense foliage or armed branches makes the chicks safer from predators.

Ebony is extremely drought tolerant. It prefers well-drained soil and full or partial sun.
