



Rostrata

Yucca rostrata

Native to west Texas, *Yucca rostrata* is becoming a popular addition to water-wise and tropical themed landscapes. Narrow blue leaves grow up to 2 feet long with a sharp spine at the end. Dead leaves make an attractive skirt along the trunk.

Rostratas prefer full sun or lightly filtered shade. Well-drained soil is a must! It grows naturally in sand and rock, so there is not need to add organic material. They can tolerate both the brutal summer heat and cold mountain temperatures.

Our plants are field grown. They tend to have a single head, but larger, older rostrata may branch near the top.
