



Cedar Elm

Ulmus crassifolia

This upright growing tree has small dark green leaves with a sand-paper like texture. It is native to all areas of Texas except the High Plains and the Panhandle. Cedar elm is easy to grow and not picky about its soil. It is drought tolerant but can handle a fair amount of moisture. It produces seed in the fall; they are small and usually go unnoticed. Some years, its leaves will turn a spectacular golden yellow.
