



# Texas Sotol

*Dasyliirion texanum*

Dasyliirion texanum is a drought-tolerant plant, native to Edwards Plateau to west Texas and south into the Mexican state of Coahuila. It is great when used as an accent or border in a water-wise landscape. Ours are field grown and will arrive with a shrink wrapped rootball.

Dasyliirion is resistant to deer and rabbits. It is very slow growing, and as it matures, will develop a short trunk. This sotol has smooth, shiny green leaves and the margin is lined with sharp curved teeth. Once it is fully mature, it forms a tall flower spike that rises well above the plant, and remains for a number of weeks. It is a long lived plant, and after several decades may grow multiple rosettes.
