



Windmill Palm

'Trachycarpus Fortunei'

The Windmill Palm is one of the most hardy palms, thriving throughout Texas. It is covered in 3 foot wide, fan-shaped fronds, and the trunk appears to be wrapped in burlap. This short palm works best as a framing tree, accent palm, or patio plant. Add it to a shady shrub border or by a front entryway. It thrives in confined spaces. Although, it does best grown in shade or fertile soil, it is fairly tolerant of margin-

al soils, as long as regular moisture is available. This palm is tolerant of wind and salt. They are susceptible to root rot, moderately so to yellowing disease and leaf spots. It is a favorite of landscapers and gardeners looking for a tropical feel.
