

Spanish Dagger *Yucca trecleana*

Spanish Dagger has a woody trunk topped with clusters of sharp-tipped, stiff leaves. Dead leaves often hang as a skirt.

Clusters of waxy, creamy– flowers appear from the center of most leave rosettes in the last spring or summer. They fade to reddish brown seeds. Birds will feed on both the flowers and the seeds. They will also nest in Spanish Dagger.

Plant in any type of soil as long as it is well drained. This is a fairly maintenance free plant if not planted near walkways.
