

Retama

Parkínsonía aculeata

Retama is an attractive south and west Texas native with graceful, airy foliage and fragrant yellow flowers . It grows north to Georgetown, west to Arizona, down to South America.

Retama is often found naturally in poorly drained sites. This is probably because it can withstand a variety of soils. It also is extremely drought tolerant, making it a wonderful candidate for water-wise landscapes and parking lot plantings. Retama also has a high salt tolerance so it a good choice for coastal conditions.

The bark is smooth with a light greenish-brown color. As the tree

ages, the bark color turns reddish brown. It's a fast grower which means that it's not a long lived tree.
